

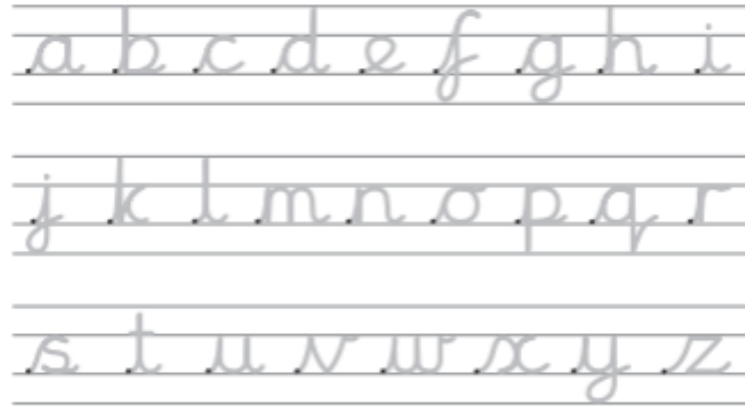
It's a snow day!!!

to keep your letters on the line.

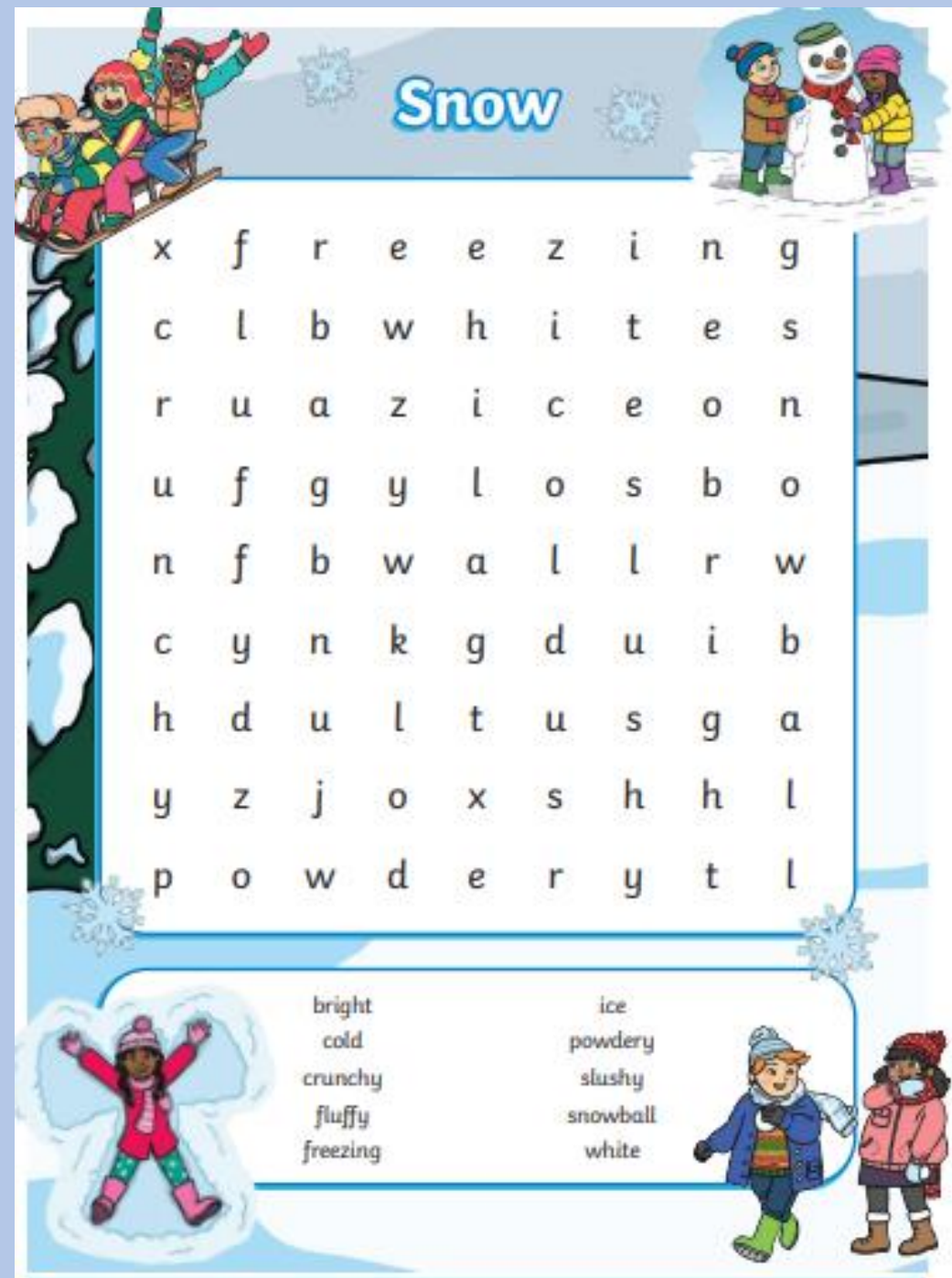

Make your own acrostic poem:

- An acrostic is a poem in which the first letters of each line spell out a word or phrase. The word or phrase can be a name, a thing, or whatever you like. Usually, the first letter of each line is capitalized. This makes it easier to see the word spelled out vertically down the page.
- ❄ Write an acrostic poem using a word related to winter or snow. Eg. SNOWFLAKE
- To create an acrostic, follow these five easy steps:
 - 1. Decide what to write about.
 - 2. Write your word down vertically.
 - 3. Brainstorm words or phrases that describe your idea.
 - 4. Place your brainstormed words or phrases on the lines that begin with the same letters.
 - 5. Fill in the rest of the lines to create a poem.
