

Possessive Apostrophes

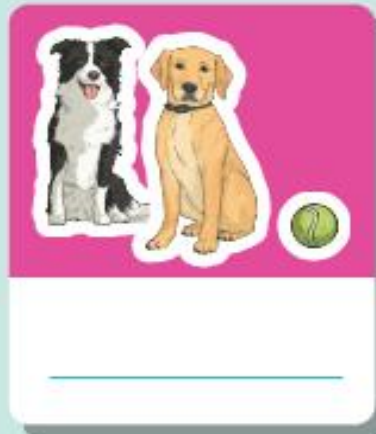
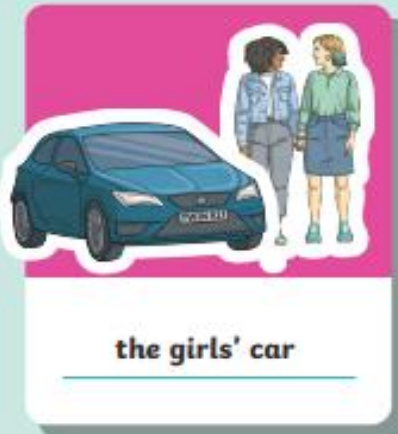
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Apostrophes can be used to show possession. When showing that one person has possession, we usually add 's. When showing that more than one person has possession of something, usually we add ' after the plural noun. This is the same no matter how many objects there are.

the girl's car = the car is owned by a **singular** girl

the girls' car = the car is owned by **plural** girls
