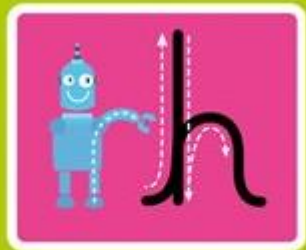

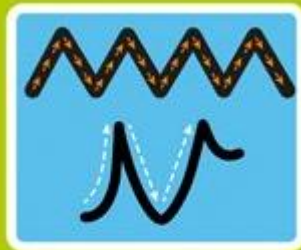

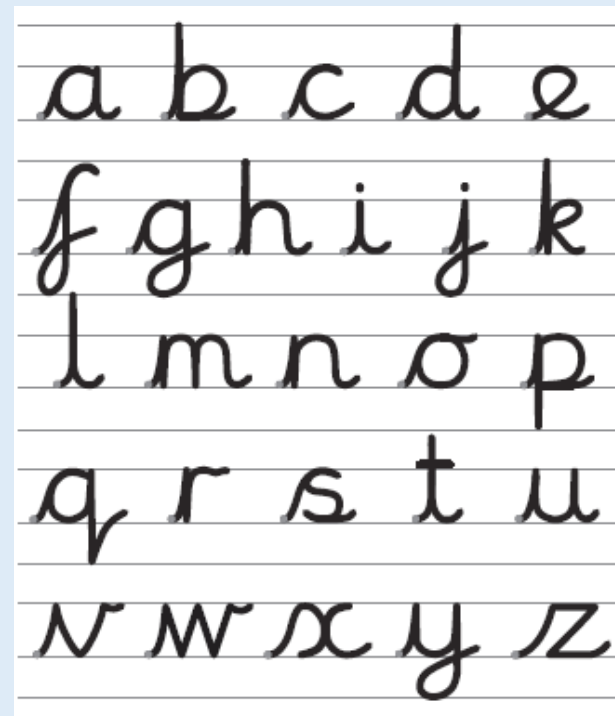

Handwriting

This is what our handwriting looks
like in Year 1:

By the end of Year 1, children are expected to be able to form all of their letters correctly with the diagonal and horizontal strokes needed to join letters.

Writing

- Focus on writing that is accurate and coherent
- Develop stamina for writing in different contexts/genres
- Write coherently and effectively – structure, grammar and vocabulary choices
- Accurate punctuation - full stops, question marks, exclamation marks and commas in lists
- Accurate spelling – using phonics, spelling patterns and common exception words
- Form letters correctly and begin to use joins between letters
- Write longer sentences using coordinating and subordinating conjunctions, such as ‘and’, ‘but’, ‘if’ or ‘because’
- Use the present and past tenses correctly in writing
- Proof-read and edit their own writing

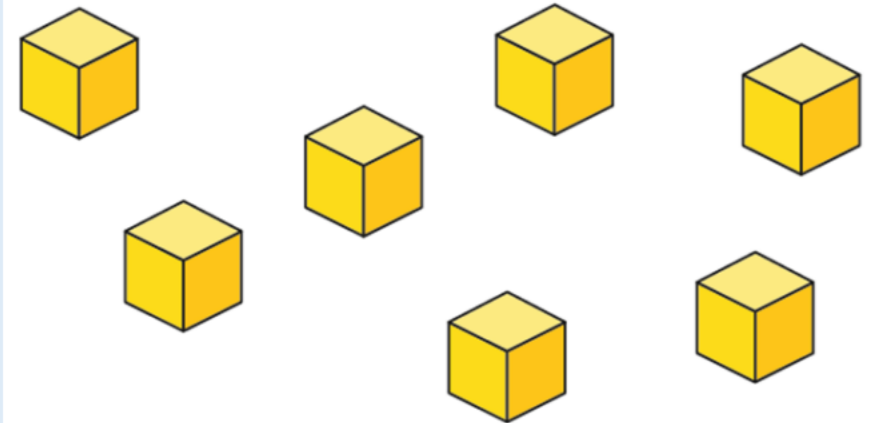

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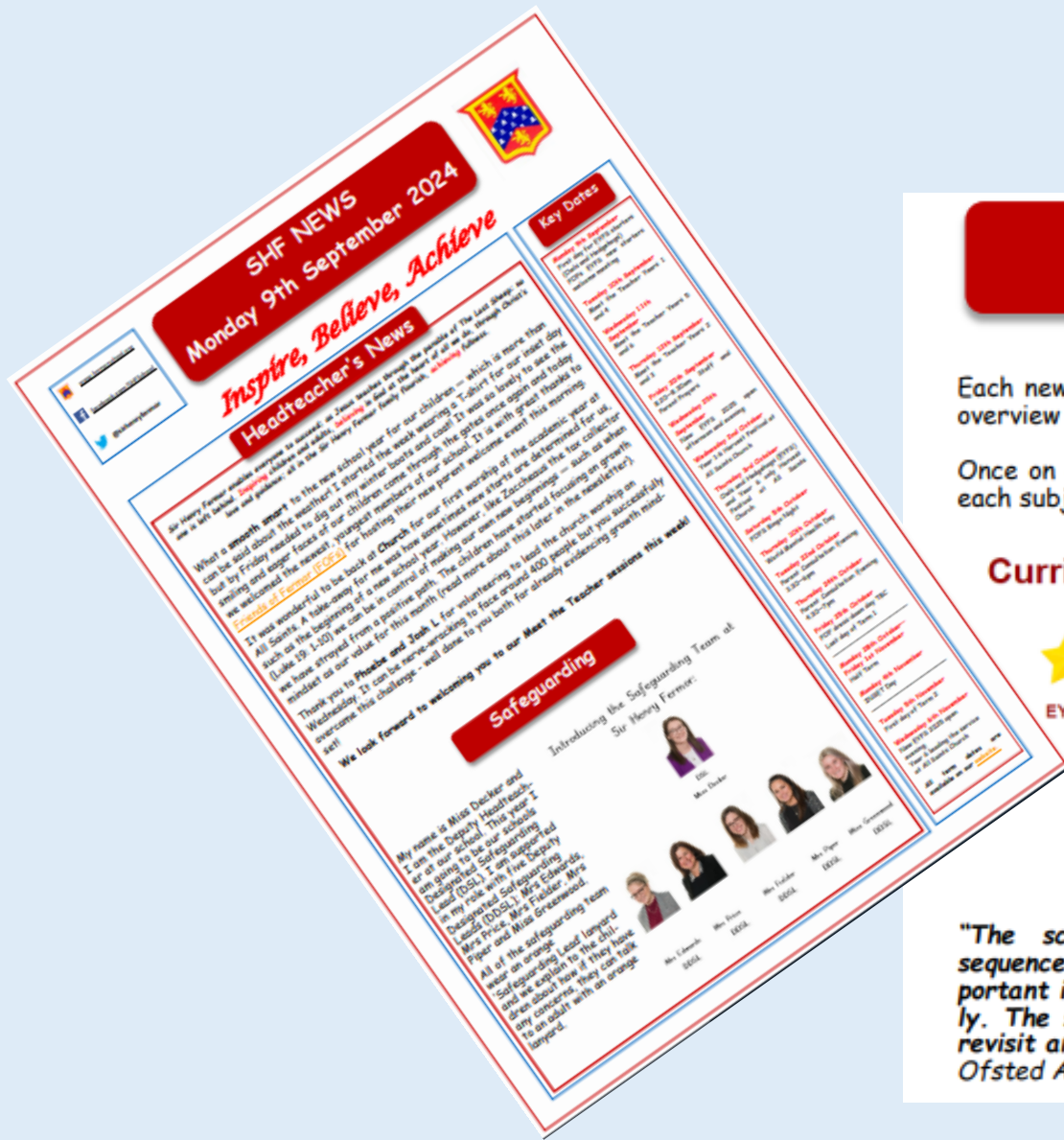
