A diorama is a model of a habitat. Think about our learning from the past few weeks and think about which habitat you like the most and would enjoy trying to make. You can use natural materials from your garden or around where you live, or you can use paper, cardboard, and any other materials you have at home, or you could use a mixture.
Parent	Make sure to support the planning stage and think carefully about the different habitats we looked at last week. Remind your child about the different plants within their chosen habitat, and help them to think about how they make their diorama look realistic and appropriate.
Activity with your child	<u>Activity</u> Build a diorama of your favourite habitat. There are pictures attached of some ideas and some animals that live in the various habitats. You will need a box and some materials for your diorama. 1. Make a list of the items you'll need and gather your supplies. 2. Make a rough sketch of your ideal diorama. 3. Select a box or container that you can use. 4. Create your background first. 5. Build up the ground or landscape. 6. Add details to make the scene realistic. 7. Put the cut out animals in, and make sure they are camouflaged. 8. Glue everything down when you're happy with the arrangement. Once you have put your diorama together cut out the animals that live there and think about where they can camouflage to stay safe or to help them to hunt. Take some pictures of your diorama and make sure you send them in, we'll see if we can spot your camouflaged animals. Once you've made it and hidden the animals, answer the questions about your diorama.
