Activities	<u>Activity 1</u> Write a review of the story about the Runaway Chapati. Answer questions about the text and give recommendations about who might like to read it. Compare it to the story of the Ginger Bread Man and describe what is the same and what parts are different. Think about the setting, the characters and the words used. You can use the question sheet or just write a paragraph in your extraordinary home learning book.	<u>Activity 2</u> Either re-tell the story of the Runaway Chapati in your extraordinary home learning book with extra detail added to describe the characters, the setting and the events using expanded noun phrases. Or alternatively create a similar story using another food that would be eaten in India such as a Poppadum, a bargi, a samosa or a nan bread. Can you include different Indian animals as characters in the story? You may need to do some research to find out which animals live in India.	<u>Activity 3</u> Produce a fact sheet about an element of India. It could be about Indian foods, Indian festivals, Indian animals or anything else such as sport, dance etc. You can use the fact sheet template on the website or just write a page in your extraordinary home learning book.
