Starter	April 23rd is Saint George's Day and so we have provided a reading activity for the children to complete if they wish. There are other more challenging versions available on the Twinkl website too. Some weeks we will be doing some recorded guided reading sessions, so look out for those.		
Parent	It would be best to hear them read one of the pieces aloud, but they could read it independently or use a device to record them reading it. You might have to read it to them so that they are able to understand the story and then they can answer the questions about it. Although the questions are worksheet based, it is not essential that they write the answers and we are happy if they just want to answer them by a discussion.

What kind of soldier was Saint George and where was he born?
