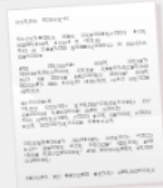

Homework

- This year it is imperative that your child does their homework. Homework is set to consolidate necessary knowledge for the SATS and plug any gaps that we feel will hold the children back in the tests.
- Homework will be set on a Friday, to be returned the next Friday when it will be marked and further tasks set for the next week.
- Tasks will usually be set from the CGP books that (with your help) we would like to order for each child. There is a cost of £7.75 per person – we will take a list at the end of this meeting to confirm who would like to order these books.
- Yr 3 and 4, and Year 5 and 6 Spelling lists.
- Last year we ran a successful homework club after school each week, for those children who struggle to complete their homework at home. Children are expected to complete their homework tasks independently but a teacher is on hand to help if needed. This will be offered again this year but under a different guise of shorter sessions on more days of the week. Details will follow soon.

Reading comprehension;

Maths arithmetic and reasoning papers 1 and 2.

PE

PE will be held on a Monday and Friday.

Your child must ensure they have their PE kit in school on these days.

To help the children be ready for the expectations of secondary school, if they have forgotten their kit, this will be followed up as follows:

1st time a verbal warning, 2nd time a yellow card and 3rd time will result in a red card.

We advise that children keep their PE kit in school all week so they do not have to worry about forgetting it on the correct days.

Head Girl and Head Boy

Every child has the opportunity to be head girl or boy for a week if they wish to be.

Responsibilities for this role usually include:

- Supporting during worships by leading prayers and dismissing students;
- Helping teachers to allocate Fermor merits to children who are making good choices;
- Ringing the play and lunch bell and choosing the best lines

Short Burst Activities and Small Group Sessions

- This year, your child may be invited to join one of our after school short-burst revision groups or work in our Year 6 shared area during lessons.
- This may be to help close a gap caused by some earlier disruption to learning, to help to secure a skill they are not yet confident with, or because they have already secured the skill being covered in class so are moving onto a different activity to develop their understanding even further.
